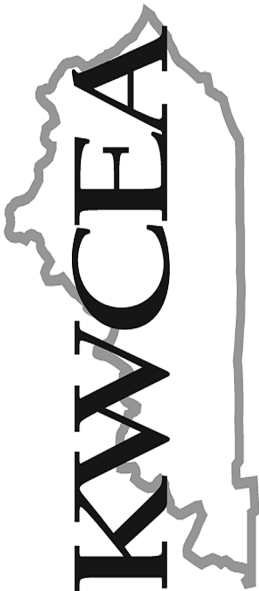

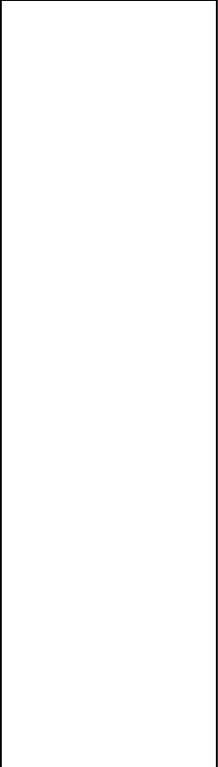

Conference Focus

What's important and what's not....what's new and what's outdated....what's legal and what isn't....what's productive and what wastes time? Most of us struggle with all of these every workday. This year KWCEA brings you a great panel of experts to address topics that you will be able to use each and everyday.

We look at basics by reviewing the going and coming rule, the issue of idiopathic falls, what's new (lots) with Medicare Set-Asides. We venture into the new world of social media networking and how Facebook, LinkedIn and other similar sites can/should be used in claims adjusting.

This year's medical track includes the nuts and bolts of occupational medicine acute care. Learn what medical facts physicians look for in treating injured workers, uncovering conflicting symptoms and determining what diagnostic tests (X-ray, CT Scan, MRI, Bone Scan, etc.) may or may not be necessary.
